CARLYLE CITY COUNCIL Regular Meeting Monday, January 12, 2009

The meeting of the Carlyle City Council was called to order at 7 p.m. by Mayor Van Johnson on Monday, January 12, 2009, in the Carlyle Council Chambers.

The following aldermen were present: Mike Burton, Ed Kleber, Don Perez, Brent Sheathelm, Steve Kauling, Jack Satterfield, David Laws, and Jan Fauke.

City employees present: Dave Redeker, John Hodapp, Danny Brammeier, Chad Holthaus, Kent Newkirk, Jim Roeckeman, Bill Gruen, and Geoff Jones.

Others present: Mark Hodapp, Toni Litzenburg, Doug Hoffman, Dean Oelze, Joe Witthaus, Tess Jackson, Deb Cohoon, Shirley Norrenberns, Joe Burdeau, Sharon Berdeaux, Don Berdeaux, Steven Stalnaker, Bernie Hustedde, Carol Hustedde, Darlene Diekemper, Kelly Ross, and Ric Golding.

Minutes from the December 8, 2008, regular meeting were accepted on a motion by Alderman Steve Kauling. The motion was seconded by Alderman Don Perez and unanimously approved by voice vote.

A motion was made by Alderman Mike Burton to approve claims as presented. The motion was seconded by Alderman Jan Fauke and approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Don Perez, Steve Kauling, Jack Satterfield, David Laws, Jan Fauke, and Mike Burton; nay – Ed Kleber. Alderman Brent Sheathelm abstained.

Alderman Mike Burton presented the Treasurer's Report for approval. There was discussion. Mayor Johnson told the Council that the city has not received an income tax check from the state since October.

A motion was made by Alderman Mike Burton to approve the Treasurer's Report as presented. The motion was seconded by Alderman Don Perez and unanimously approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Don Perez, Brent Sheathelm, Steve Kauling, Jack Satterfield, David Laws, Jan Fauke, Mike Burton, and Ed Kleber; nay – none.

Alderman Burton presented a request from Bill Gruen for the purchase of a work station for document storage at a cost of \$1,413.65 from TinCans Wireless Internet. Bill noted that he may need a scanner and better software if adobe does not work.

A motion was made by Alderman Mike Burton to approve the purchase of a work station for \$1,413.65 as requested. The motion was seconded by Alderman Jan Fauke and unanimously approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Brent Sheathelm, Steve Kauling, Jack Satterfield, David Laws, Jan Fauke, Mike Burton, Ed Kleber, and Don Perez; nay – none.

Alderman Burton presented a request from Geoff Jones for the purchase of a carbon feed system. The low bid was \$5,144 from Ressler & Associates. There was brief discussion.

A motion was made by Alderman Mike Burton to approve the purchase of a carbon feed system for \$5,144 as requested. The motion was seconded by Alderman Ed Kleber and unanimously approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Steve Kauling, Jack Satterfield, David Laws, Jan Fauke, Mike Burton, Ed Kleber, Don Perez, and Brent Sheathelm; nay – none.

Alderman Burton presented a request from Geoff Jones for the purchase of an air conditioner for the water plant. The current unit is about 30 years old. The low bid was \$3,634 from Jack's Sales and Repairs. Alderman Kleber expressed concern that this is a conflict of interest. Mayor Johnson asked Geoff about specs for the unit. Geoff said that everyone submitted a bid for the same thing according to specs. Alderman Kleber said he

would like to get a ruling from the Attorney General or the Illinois Municipal League. There was discussion.

A motion was made by Alderaman Mike Burton to accept the bid of \$3,634 for a new air conditioner from Jack's Sales and Repair as presented. The motion was seconded by Alderman Jan Fauke and approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – David Laws, Jan Fauke, Mike Burton, Don Perez, and Steve Kauling; nay – Ed Kleber. Aldermen Jack Satterfield and Brent Sheathelm abstained.

Dave Redeker told the Council that the pool will have to be in compliance with a new grate. They will not know what is needed until March or April when the pool is drained.

John Hodapp reported that the transformer is set at the new Wal-Mart.

Jim Roeckeman reported that the library will have Story Hour on January 17, 2009, from 10-11 a.m. He also noted that there is a display case at the library for public use.

Bill Gruen reported that construction on the street and roof at the new Wal-Mart is behind schedule. He also reported that there will be a Public Bike Path meeting at city hall on January 15, 2009, at 4 p.m.

Mayor Johnson asked to Council to set meeting dates for the upcoming year.

A motion was made by Alderman Don Perez to set meeting date for the Carlyle City Council for the 2nd and 4th Monday of each month beginning at 7 p.m. The motion was seconded by Alderman David Laws and unanimously approved by voice vote.

The Christmas In Carlyle Committee thanked the city for all of their help with the event and asked for financial support for next year's plans. Alderman Fauke told the committee that the Park Board met last week and discussed the cost. She noted that 80% of the lights were replaced this year at a cost of \$3,000-\$4,000. Mayor Johnson added that a lot of money has been spent on infrastructure. He then asked the committee about their financial status. Toni Litzenburg told him that they received \$1,760 in donations in addition to what the city gave them. Alderman Perez suggested asking the Street Fair Committee for a donation. There was lengthy discussion. Alderman Fauke asked how soon they need to know. Mrs. Litzenburg said they would like to know by March or April.

Mayor Johnson shared an e-mail he received regarding the display and a thank you note from the committee. Bill Gruen added that there is a great picture of the park on the flicker website.

Bill Gruen presented information on the 11th Street Highway Agreement with the Carlyle Fire Protection District. He told the Council that there is lingering contamination, but it is minor and deep. The Fire Protection District's environmental agent drafted an agreement, and the Street and Alley Committee recommends approval. They also want a side agreement so that costs that would be incurred are the responsibility of the fire protection district. There was discussion. It was noted that there is no water line on that street.

A motion was made by Alderman David Laws to approve the 11th Street Agreement as presented contingent on approval of the side agreement to cover costs. The motion was seconded by Alderman Steve Kauling and unanimously approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – David Laws, Jan Fauke, Mike Burton, Ed Kleber, Don Perez, Brent Sheathelm, Steve Kauling, and Jack Satterfield; nay – none.

Bill Gruen presented information on a request for the Hawk Development Annexation of approximately 4 acres. It would be zoned B-2 and a special use permit is needed for a barbed wire fence for storage. The Zoning Board recommended approval, but no final action will be taken at this time. Bill will move forward with annexation.

Bill Gruen presented a request from Bernie Hustedde of 1370 Jefferson Street for setback variances. A detatched garage is currently on the property, and he would like to put up a garage double in size keeping the current setbacks of under 2' in the rear and 4' on the side. The Zoning Board recommended approval.

A motion was made by Alderman Jan Fauke to approve the variance setbacks of under 2' in the rear and 4' on the side for the construction of a garage at 1370 Jefferson Street as requested. The motion was seconded by Alderman David Laws and unanimously approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Jan Fauke, Mike Burton, Ed Kleber, Don Perez, Brent Sheathelm, Steve Kauling, Jack Satterfield, and David Laws; nay – none.

Bill Gruen presented a request from Dr. Matt Bretz for the construction of 2 wooden fence sections on the west property lines at 611 13th Street and 631 13th Street. The Zoning Board did not recommend approval because of opposition. Alderman Fauke noted that there should be a deed restriction stating that the fence has to be vinyl.

A motion was made by Alderman Jan Fauke not to allow the construction of wooden fence sections at 611 13th Street and 631 13th Street as requested. The motion was seconded by Alderman Ed Kleber and unanimously approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Mike Burton, Ed Kleber, Don Perez, Brent Sheathelm, Steve Kauling, Jack Satterfield, David Laws, and Jan Fauke; nay – none.

Alderman Kauling presented a rough draft from Vahlkamp Construction for a new pool house. After talking to this contractor, he suggested tearing the old one down and starting over because of various problems. Construction would take about 4 months, so nothing would be done until the end of the 2009 season. Alderman Perez stated that Carlyle is hosting the Swim Team Conference in 2010, and it could be ready for that event. Alderman Fauke added that the estimated cost is \$250,000 including demolition, and the new construction would be under roof. There was discussion. Alderman Burton stated that something has to be done. There were no objections from the Council to get plans drawn up.

Alderman Kauling told the Council that the city will have to provide defibulators at various locations. The estimated cost is \$1,500-\$2,000 per unit, and they may need as many as five.

Don Berdeaux asked when construction will start on the new CVS store. He was told that residents have until January 25, 2009, to vacate.

Mayor Johnson read a thank you note from the Clinton County Historical Society for the donation they received from the city.

Mayor Johnson shared a thank you note from Sharon Berdeaux in appreciation of the Christmas Gift Certificate.

With no further business, a motion to adjourn was made by Alderman Mike Burton and seconded by Alderman Don Perez. The motion was unanimously approved by voice vote, and the meeting adjourned at 8 p.m.

CARLYLE CITY COUNCIL Regular Meeting Monday, January 26, 2009

The meeting of the Carlyle City Council was called to order at 7 p.m. by Mayor Van Johnson on Monday, January 26, 2009, in the Carlyle Council Chambers.

The following aldermen were present: Mike Burton, Ed Kleber, Don Perez, Steve Kauling, Jack Satterfield, David Laws, and Jan Fauke. Alderman Brent Sheathelm arrived at 7:05 p.m.

City employees present: Kent Newkirk, Bill Gruen, Steve Lappe, John Hodapp, and Danny Brammeier.

Others present: Joe Burdeau, Joe Witthaus, Don Berdeaux, Mark Hodapp, Dick Connors, Carl Huels, Dean Oelze, and Kelly Ross.

Minutes from January 12, 2009, were accepted on a motion by Alderman Steve Kauling. The motion was seconded by Alderman Don Perez and unanimously approved by voice vote.

A motion was made by Alderman Mike Burton to approve transfers of \$5,000 to Street & Alley and \$50,000 to Police for a total of \$55,000. The motion was seconded by Alderman Jan Fauke and unanimously approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Steve Kauling, Jack Satterfield, David Laws, Jan Fauke, Mike Burton, Ed Kleber, Don Perez, and Brent Sheathelm; nay – none.

Alderman Burton reported that the EDC will meet on Thursday.

John Hodapp reported that the electrical hook-up at the new Wal-Mart is complete.

Bill Gruen told the Council that the IMRF suffered investment losses in 2008, so rates will be going up in the future. The city may need to appropriate another \$110,000 to cover the increase. Bill will have more information at a later date.

Bill Gruen reported that he will be attending a meeting in Springfield on Thursday regarding economic stimulus financing.

Bill Gruen told the Council that he is still working on an ordinance to allow wine sales and tasting at the farmers market. He said he wanted to make sure the Council is still in agreement with this idea. There were no objections.

Bill Gruen told the Council that he sent out about 70 sponsor solicitations for the IHSA fishing tournament. He also sent out vendor applications. He is looking for one lead sponsor at \$10,000 as well as lower sponsorships.

The Bike Path Planning Committee met last week. It was reported that the Corp received a \$10,000 Hand Shake Grant for designing and printing a brochure.

Dick Connors addressed the Council regarding the Cruising the Dam event. He stated that it is getting bigger than they anticipated and asked the city for assistance for the August 14, 2009 event. Mr. Connors told the Council that they had about 300 cars last year, and they are becoming concerned about liability and crowd control. He went on to say that he feels they can get 500 cars here, and he sees it as an economic development opportunity. There was discussion. Alderman Kleber said that he supports it 100%.

Mr. Connors told the Council that they spend about \$1,000 to put on the event; and if the city is interested in helping financially, they could make it bigger. Bill Gruen asked about liability. He was told that it is covered through Carl's business. Bill then asked what they want from the city regarding liability. Mr. Connors said his concern is when crowds gather to watch them go through town. There was additional discussion. Mr. Connors said they could use a couple of electrical outlet for concessions and lighting.

Mayor Johnson said the city could provide that. He then told Mr. Connors to work with Bill Gruen if he has any additional questions or concerns.

Bill Gruen presented information on TIF distributions. It was noted that CUD #1 already received \$110,000.

A motion was made by Alderman Don Perez to approve TIF distributions as presented. The motion was seconded by Alderman Jack Satterfield and unanimously approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Jack Satterfield, David Laws, Jan Fauke, Mike Burton, Ed Kleber, Don Perez, Brent Sheathelm, and Steve Kauling; nay – none.

Mayor Johnson presented information on the Water Bond Tax Abatement Ordinance.

A motion was made by Alderman Ed Kleber to approve the Water Bond Tax Abatement Ordinance as presented and waive the second reading. The motion was seconded by Alderman Brent Sheathelm and unanimously approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – David Laws, Jan Fauke, Mike Burton, Ed Kleber, Don Perez, Brent Sheathelm, Steve Kauling, and Jack Satterfield; nay – none.

Mayor Johnson told the Council that after researching the legality of aldermen doing work for the city, they found that a seated alderman is limited to \$2,000 per job or \$4,000 per year. Therefore, they will have to re-bid the air conditioning job for the water plant.

With no further business, a motion to adjourn was made by Alderman David Laws and seconded by Alderman Don Perez. The motion was unanimously approved by voice vote, and the meeting adjourned at 7:45 p.m.

Alderman Jan Fauke reported that the library will have story hour beginning Wednesday, February 11, 2009, from 3:30 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. She also told the Council that the Clinton County Historical Society has a valentines display at the library.

Alderman Fauke told the Council that the Employee Concerns Committee has been meeting regarding negotiations.

Alderman Steve Kauling reported that the Park Board will meet at 1 p.m. tomorrow to discuss summer hires.

Alderman Ed Kleber reported that the Progress Committee met earlier to discuss a downtown event, but various details have to be worked out. John Lieber told the Council that they are looking at May 16, 2009, as the proposed date. They will have more details at a later date.

Alderman Ed Kleber asked if the city could extend street lights north of town. Mayor Johnson said they would have to look at easements. It was referred to the Electric Committee. John Hodapp stated that it would take about 35 poles.

Danny Brammeier thanked the Electric and Water Departments for help with snow removal. Mayor Johnson complimented all departments for a great job.

John Hodapp told the Council that Paul Becker is back from Metropolis. He also reported that they are vacating the alley for the new CVS. Bill Gruen noted that there is now a sign at the corner of 12th and Franklin stating that the new CVS is coming soon.

Bill Gruen reported that he will be at the boat show this coming weekend. He has plenty of volunteers, and he greatly appreciates the support. It was noted that the deer show is the same weekend as the boat show.

Mayor Johnson presented the first reading of the Ordinance to Temporarily Block Third Party Demand Response Aggregators as proposed by IMEA. Ken Mehochko told the Council he has reviewed the ordinance.

The Council entered into Executive Session at 7:20 p.m.

The Council returned to Open Session at 8:05 p.m.

A motion was made by Alderman Mike Burton to approve transfers of \$15,000 to Street & Alley, \$40,000 to Police, and \$5,000 to Economic Development for a total of \$60,000. The motion was seconded by Alderman Brent Sheathelm and unanimously approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Jan Fauke, Mike Burton, Ed Kleber, Don Perez, Brent Sheathelm, Steve Kauling, Jack Satterfield, and David Laws; nay – none.

Alderman Mike Burton presented a request from John Hodapp for the purchase of three transformers. The low bid was from Jerry's Electric at \$895 each for a total of \$2,685.

A motion was made by Alderman Mike Burton to approve the purchase of three transformers for \$2,685 as presented. The motion was seconded by Alderman Steve Kauling and unanimously approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Mike Burton, Ed Kleber, Don Perez, Brent Sheathelm, Steve Kauling, Jack Satterfield, David Laws, and Jan Fauke; nay – none.

Alderman Mike Burton presented a request from Dave Redeker for the purchase of two 30hp Cobalt mowers for a cost of \$4,675 each from Gebke Bros. for a total of \$9,350. This bid includes a 2 ¹/₂ year warranty and trade in of 2 current mowers.

A motion was made by Alderman Mike Burton to approve the purchase of two mowers for a total cost of \$9,350 with trade-in as requested. The motion was seconded by Alderman Don Perez and unanimously approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Ed Kleber, Don Perez, Brent Sheathelm, Steve Kauling, Jack Satterfield, David Laws, Jan Fauke, and Mike Burton; nay – none.

Alderman Burton presented a request for the purchase of 8 defibrillator packages with fast response kits and a program management manual at a cost of \$1,670 each as well as wall signs, a cabinet with alarm, and training pad. The total cost of the equipment from SOS Technologies is \$13,788.55.

A motion was made by Alderman Mike Burton to approve the purchase of defibrillators and accessories for a total of \$13,788.55 as presented. The motion was seconded by Alderman Steve Kauling and unanimously approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Don Perez, Brent Sheathelm, Steve Kauling, Jack Satterfield, David Laws, Jan Fauke, Mike Burton, and Ed Kleber; nay – none.

Alderman Burton presented a request from Danny Brammeier for the purchase of a laser level from NU WAY Concrete Forms at a cost of \$1,400.

A motion was made by Alderman Mike Burton to approve the purchase of a laser level for \$1,400 as requested. The motion was seconded by Alderman Jack Satterfield and unanimously approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Brent Sheathelm, Steve

Kauling, Jack Satterfield, David Laws, Jan Fauke, Mike Burton, Ed Kleber, and Don Perez; nay – none.

Alderman Jan Fauke reported that the Employee Concerns Committee met earlier with reps from the Clerical Union. They will meet again on March 9, 2009 at 4:30 p.m.

Alderman David Laws reported that the Street & Alley Committee met on Tuesday, February 18, at 8 a.m. They received a second complaint regarding the storm sewer at 4th and Franklin. Danny is going to go out and check elevation. It was noted that work was already done at that location, but it did not fix the problem. They might have to put in a larger drain.

Alderman Laws told the Council that a new business will be locating on Eula Mae Parkway, and they need to consider upgrading that street. He added that Motor Fuel Tax has gone down, and the city might have to go to a 4 or 5-year rotation instead of the 3year rotation they currently use for oiling and chipping. They will also be cutting back on sidewalks.

Alderman Jack Satterfield congratulated Mayor Johnson for being elected to the IMEA Executive Board on Thursday. He also reported on the Electric Committee meeting. They discussed the basement floor and street lights. The committee decided that they could eliminate 11 street lights on the west end and save about \$1,300 per year. They also discussed extending lights north of town. Materials alone would cost about \$23,000, and the committee does not recommend doing that at this time.

Alderman Steve Kauling reported that the Park Board will meet tomorrow (February 24), at 1 p.m.

Alderman Ed Kleber told the Council that the sign that the city has at McDonalds is difficult to see, and it should be removed. There was discussion. Alderman Sheathelm suggested trading it in for a bigger one. Alderman Fauke noted that NEVCO has laid off all of their workers.

A motion was made by Alderman David Laws to take down the city's sign that is currently placed near McDonalds. The motion was seconded by Alderman Don Perez and unanimously approved by voice vote.

Alderman Kleber said he feels that the addition of new businesses like the lumber yard, CVS, Hardees, and Bretz's says something about Carlyle. Mayor Johnson agreed. He reminded the Council that they still need to be fiscally responsible.

Chief Newkirk told the Council that the new squad car will be in soon.

Dave Redeker reported that sign-up for softball and baseball will be the first 3 Saturdays in March from 8 a.m. until 2 p.m. at the park shed.

Bill Gruen reported that they closed on the Hardees loan, and the new owners are already working on the building. He then reminded the Council that it is time to review Executive Session minutes. Bill also shared three new brochures promoting Carlyle.

Bill Gruen told the Council that overall attendance was down at the boat show this year. The video promoting Carlyle that was shown there will be available for viewing after the meeting.

Mayor Johnson presented the second reading of the ordinance for electric department charges for development and new infrastructure.

A motion was made by Alderman Ed Kleber to approve the Electric Department Charges for Development and New Infrastructure Ordinance as presented. The motion was seconded by Alderman Don Perez and unanimously approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Steve Kauling, Jack Satterfield, David Laws, Jan Fauke, Mike Burton, Ed Kleber, Don Perez, and Brent Sheathelm; nay – none. Mayor Johnson presented an Ordinance to allow Riverton, Illinois back into the IMEA. He recommended approval.

He stated that the water tank will help with growth to the north and a lift station should solve the sewer problem at 11th Street. The city has applied for stimulus money as well as low interest loans. There was discussion. Alderman Burton told the Council that if we get this, we're looking at 20 years. If we do not get the money, we're looking at a 40-year bond. Bill Gruen added that the EPA is the agency we would apply to, and they will help with up to 50% of the project.

A motion was made by Alderman Brent Sheathelm to approve paying HMG up to \$111,525 for design work for a new water tower. The motion was seconded by Alderman David Laws and unanimously approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Steve Kauling, Jack Satterfield, David Laws, Jan Fauke, Mike Burton, Ed Kleber, Don Perez, and Brent Sheathelm; nay – none.

A motion was made by Alderman Brent Sheathelm to approve paying HMG \$59,345 for the design of a wastewater relief pump station. The motion was seconded by Alderman Jack Satterfield and unanimously approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Jack Satterfield, David Laws, Jan Fauke, Mike Burton, Ed Kleber, Don Perez, Brent Sheathelm, and Steve Kauling; nay – none.

Alderman Fauke asked if any more is being done about a recycling program. Bill said he has been looking into a program with Brisk Sanitation. He is also looking into bins at various locations. Alderman Fauke asked if residents have to sort their recyclables with the Brisk program. She was told that they do not. There was discussion about the letter from Community Link. Sharon Berdeaux explained the Brisk program.

Joe Burdeau told the Council that he would like to see the new mayor address TIF. He stated that the public has a lot of questions. There was discussion. Mayor Johnson stated that TIF gives back a lot of money to the school district. Alderman Fauke said she feels it is always good for the public to have a better understanding, but TIF is complicated. Alderman Burton added that he's not sure the public would fully understand it.

With no further business, a motion to adjourn was made by Alderman Brent Sheathelm and seconded by Alderman Don Perez. The motion was unanimously approved by voice vote, and the meeting adjourned at 8:15 p.m.

Minutes from April 13, 2009, were presented for approval. Alderman David Laws noted that page 2, paragraph 13, states "Alderman" Steve Lappe reported; and the word Alderman should be deleted.

A motion was made by Alderman David Laws to approve minutes from April 13, 2009, as corrected. The motion was seconded by Alderman Steve Kauling and unanimously approved by voice vote.

A motion was made by Alderman Mike Burton to approve transfers of \$15,000 to Street & Alley, \$70,000 to Police, \$5,000 to Parks, \$25,000 to Playground, and \$5,000 to Library, for a total of \$120,000. The motion was seconded by Alderman Don Perez and unanimously approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Mike Burton, Ed Kleber, Don Perez, Brent Sheathelm, Steve Kauling, Jack Satterfield, David Laws, and Jan Fauke; nay – none.

Alderman Burton presented a request from Geoff Jones for the purchase of 2 computers and hardware from Techknow Solutions in Breese, Illinois, at a cost of \$1,548. Software installation would be done by BHMG out of Arnold, Missouri, at a cost of \$3,300. The total request is for \$4,848.

A motion was made by Alderman Mike Burton to approve the purchase of 2 computers and hardware with software installation as requested for a total cost of \$4,848. The motion was seconded by Alderman Ed Kleber and unanimously approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Ed Kleber, Don Perez, Brent Sheathelm, Steve Kauling, Jack Satterfield, David Laws, Jan Fauke, and Mike Burton; nay – none.

Alderman David Laws reported on the citywide clean-up. He said they are planning another one in the fall.

Alderman Burton reported that the EDC is moving ahead with the Carlyle web page updates.

Jim Roeckeman told the Council that the library is changing their Friday hours. They were previously open from 9 a.m. until 2 p.m. They will now be open from 12 noon until 5 p.m. on Fridays.

Bill Gruen reported that he is still looking for volunteers for the bass tournament. A commercial promoting the celebration will begin May 2.

Bill Gruen presented information regarding a senate bill that is currently in the house that deals with star bonds. It deals with a 900-acre retail tourism project in Glen Carbon. He told the Council that he is not ready to take a position at this time, but he wanted to make them aware of what is going on.

Bill Gruen presented a variance request from Dave and Pauletta Goodin for a 28' x 34' home expansion at 1950 Washington Street. He noted that there is a medical emergency with her parents, and they would like quick approval. Alderman Kleber said he looked at the proposed site, and everything around them protrudes beyond the addition. He recommended approval of this request without taking it to the Zoning Board. Alderman Fauke said she doesn't have a problem with the request, but she thinks it should go through the proper channels. Alderman Kleber said taking it through the Zoning Board will take up to a month. There was discussion. Mayor Johnson asked Ken Mehochko about the legality. Ken said that their ordinance and state statute does not allow them to do this. The request will go to the Zoning Board.

Mayor Johnson opened discussion on the city water tower project. He noted that the design and location was previously approved, but there has been opposition from some residents. He added that the chosen location will save the city about \$200,000. Kay Wessol told the Council that she is concerned that it will destroy the beauty of that area. Bob Wilkens said the location is actually in their operations area. Alderman Burton stated that adding \$200,000 to this project will increase water rates for all customers. Alderman Laws asked how high it will be. Dave Rodden said it will be 157 ft. tall regardless of where it is located. Alderman Fauke said she has been against another water tower for years. She added that the city does not have a storage problem--they have a pressure problem. She went on to say that Steve Lappe told her that they currently deal with stagnant water in the east end tower, and adding another tower will cause problems with stagnant water in the west tower as well. She said she would like to see them look into pumps. There was lengthy discussion.

Mayor Johnson said they have been debating the Krebs Hill pressure problem for almost 10 years. Dave Rodden addressed the options. He stated that the initial cost of a tower will be a lot more. Pumps will use electricity and require maintenance. He then noted that the savings for putting the tower in the proposed location is more like \$100,000. Alderman Fauke pointed out that they just spent \$200,000 on maintenance of the west end tower. Alderman Kauling asked about the life of a pump. Mr. Rodden said it should last about 10 years if well maintained. Geoff added that it also depends on how much they run. Alderman Perez said he feels they need to look at all of the options. Alderman Kauling said he's worried about the fire protection issue.

Alderman Fauke said she would like to see a cost on pumps. Dave Rodden told her that pumps would be cheaper. It's a reliability issue. There was additional discussion.

A motion was made by Alderman Jan Fauke to cease on the water tower project and get a cost on a pumping system and explore that option. The motion was seconded by Alderman Don Perez and failed by the following vote: Aye – Don Perez and Jan Fauke; nay – Brent Sheathelm, Steve Kauling, Jack Satterfield, David Laws, Mike Burton, and Ed Kleber.

Dave Rodden said he can send the pump information to the EPA and see what they say. Alderman Burton asked if they could get stimulus money if they go with pumps. Mr. Rodden said they can if the EPA will permit it.

Bill Gruen presented the proposed code amendment to allow wine tasting at the Carlyle Farmers Market. This would be a Class "G" license that would only be used at the Carlyle Farmers Market.

A motion was made by Alderman Brent Sheathelm to approve the Class "G" license for wine tasting at the Carlyle Farmers Market as presented. The motion was seconded by Alderman Don Perez and unanimously approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Brent Sheathelm, Steve Kauling, Jack Satterfield, David Laws, Jan Fauke, Mike Burton, Ed Kleber, and Don Perez; nay – none.

Bill Gruen presented information on the 3-year contract for the IHSA Bass Tournament. He noted that several changes had been made including a staging location change, security night watchman removed, coast guard auxiliary will not patrol, no meal provisions for IHSA staff, and concession proceeds will be kept by vendors. The city is responsible for restriction of alcohol and tobacco only at the Dam West Access area. Alderman Kleber complimented Bill for the excellent job he has done organizing this event.

A motion was made by Alderman Ed Kleber to approve the 3-year IHSA Bass Tournament contract as presented. The motion was seconded by Alderman Steve Kauling and unanimously approved by voice vote.

The Council was asked to approve Ordinance 1419 to redistribute line item funds. This ordinance does not increase the amount appropriated.

A motion was made by Alderman Mike Burton to approve the line item redistribution ordinance as presented and waive the second reading. The motion was seconded by Alderman Brent Sheathelm and unanimously approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Steve Kauling, Jack Satterfield, David Laws, Jan Fauke, Mike Burton, Ed Kleber, Don Perez, and Brent Sheathelm; nay – none.

Bill Gruen told the Council that he received a letter from a gentleman who has footage of the 1953 dedication of the General Dean Suspension Bridge. It is a 16mm film with sound, and it will cost \$240 to transfer it to digital format. There was not objection.

Bill Gruen presented information on the FY10 marketing commitment to the Tourism Bureau. He said they do not have a plan yet, but they need to know what our commitment is so that grant applications can be completed. Bill recommended \$30,000.

Alderman Kleber told the Council that the Library Board met on June 1, 2009. He introduced Dr. DuComb to explain the fun fair to be held from 1-4 p.m. on Saturday. The summer reading program is Read on the Wild Side. They have also booked 3 programs scheduled for July 10, July 31, and August 6.

Chief Newkirk reported that the Police Committee will meet tomorrow at 10 a.m.

Bill Gruen presented a request for demolition assistance from St. Joseph Hospital for the demolition of the old church at 14505 State Route 127. The low bid was \$17,950 from KR B Excavation. The city only pays a maximum of \$2,500. There was brief discussion.

A motion was made by Alderman Ed Kleber to approve payment of \$2,500 for demolition assistance at 14505 State Route 127 as requested. The motion was seconded by Alderman Don Perez and unanimously approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Jack Satterfield, Jeff Taylor, Steve Kauling, David Laws, Mike Burton, Ed Kleber, Don Perez, and Brent Sheathelm; nay – none.

There was discussion.

The meeting opened with the pledge of allegiance led by Alderman Ed Kleber.

A motion was made by Alderman Steve Kauling to approve minutes from July 14, 2009. The motion was seconded by Alderman Jack Satterfield and unanimously approved by voice vote.

A motion was made by Alderman Mike Burton to approve the Treasurer's Report as presented. The motion was seconded by Alderman Don Perez and unanimously approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – David Laws, Mike Burton, Ed Kleber, Don Perez, Brent Sheathelm, Jack Satterfield, Jeff Taylor, and Steve Kauling; nay – none.

A motion was made by Alderman Mike Burton to approve transfers of \$30,000 to Street & Alley, \$60,000 to Police, \$5,000 to Economic Development, \$25,000 to Parks, \$50,000 to Playground, and \$5,000 to Library for a total of \$175,000. The motion was seconded by Alderman Don Perez and unanimously approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Mike Burton, Ed Kleber, Don Perez, Brent Sheathelm, Jack Satterfield, Jeff Taylor, Steve Kauling, and David Laws; nay – none.

Alderman Burton presented a request from the Police Department for the purchase of items for the squad car. The total cost from Whiteside Communications would be \$5,530. It was noted that all items are state bid prices.

Bill Gruen reported on the Water/Sewer Committee Meeting. They discussed water tower financing. He also reported that the city has been asked to be a plaintiff in a law suit regarding atrizine. The committee would like to do more research before joining this suit. Sewer extension will be discussed by the Zoning Board.

Alderman Kauling reported on the Park Board Meeting. They talked about replacing venues at the old city park by the grade school. Alderman Laws asked about keeping them the same size, because bigger groups use the grade school area.

Alderman Satterfield reported on the Police Committee Meeting.

Jim Roeckeman reported that they are winding up their summer programs with Reptile Experience and a magician.

Danny Brammeier told the Council that they will finish oiling streets tomorrow.

Dave Redeker reported that about 200 people attended the movie in the park event.

Bill Gruen apologized for not having the agenda on line, but the web site was down.

Mayor Fauke presented the Krebs pre-annexation for consideration. Attorney Mehochko told the Council that there was an oil and gas lease from 1995 with a 1-year term, so it has expired. With no producing well on the property at this time, there is no legal agreement.

A motion was made by Alderman Don Perez to approve the Krebs Pre-Annexation as presented. The motion was seconded by Alderman Jack Satterfield and unanimously approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Don Perez, Brent Sheathelm, Jack Satterfield, Jeff Taylor, Steve Kauling, David Laws, Mike Burton, and Ed Kleber; nay – none.

Mayor Fauke asked the Council to consider annexation of the Krebs property and the Andy Diekemper property. Alderman Kleber asked about oil rights. Ken told him that it was also from 1995. He added that the property is too small for a well.

A motion was made by Alderman David Laws to approve the annexation of the Krebs property and the Andy Diekemper property. The motion was seconded by Alderman Brent Sheathelm and unanimously approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Brent Sheathelm, Jack Satterfield, Jeff Taylor, Steve Kauling, David Laws, Mike Burton, Ed Kleber, and Don Perez; nay – none.

Don Berdeaux addressed the Council regarding a donation for the proposed veteran memorial at Kaskaskia College. The memorial will list all who have served—not just the deceased. He told them that the official kick-off will take place September 11, 2009, and they already have over 9,000 names. This memorial will take about 3 years to complete, and will be named "Enduring Freedom." Carlyle was asked to be the first city to donate. Mayor Fauke expressed concern about one taxing body making a donation to another taxing body. Attorney Mehochko said the question is whether the city has the authority to make a donation. He added that he is willing to research the issue if the Council wants him to. Mr. Berdeaux told her that he already talked to Dr. Underwood at Kaskaskia College, and said there will be no problem. He then asked for a commitment pending verification of the legality.

Alderman Perez said he would like to make a donation for the memorial, but he feels \$25,000 would not be in the best interest of the taxpayers. Alderman Kleber said he would like to see the full \$25,000 given to this project. Mayor Fauke suggested waiting until the next meeting before they decide. Fred Becker told the Council that the county had an issue with a not-for-profit donation for seniors, so they had to do a tax levy. There was brief discussion. No action was taken at this time.

Leslie Lucas addressed the Council on behalf of Jamie Kohrman regarding the Fall Festival she is organizing for August 29 & 30. She said that Jamie is having some concerns about the cost of ads. She is looking at a cost of about \$860 just for local advertisement.

A motion was made by Alderman Jeff Taylor and seconded by Alderman Ed Kleber to make a donation of \$1,000 for advertisement of the Fall Festival. Alderman Burton said it could come out of the Hotel/Motel Tax Fund. Bill Gruen told him that they have money budgeted in the Economic Development Fund that could be used for local advertisement. There was discussion. Alderman Taylor amended his motion for a \$1,000 donation with the money coming from either the Hotel/Motel Tax Fund or the Economic Development Fund. The amended motion was seconded by Alderman Ed Kleber and unanimously approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Jack Satterfield, Jeff Taylor, Steve Kauling, David Laws, Mike Burton, Ed Kleber, Don Perez, and Brent Sheathelm; nay – none.

Mayor Fauke read a letter from Geoff Jones recommending the permanent hire of Andy Wennerstrom. He completed his 1-year probation as of July 15, 2009.

A motion was made by Alderman Steve Kauling to approve the permanent hiring of Andy Wennerstrom as recommended. The motion was seconded by Alderman Jack Satterfield and unanimously approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Jeff Taylor, Steve Kauling, David Laws, Mike Burton, Ed Kleber, Don Perez, Brent Sheathelm, and Jack Satterfield; nay – none.

Kevin Wessel and Pat Nettemeyer presented plans for the new pool house. Kevin noted that he made a change on the design of the roof. Alderman Fauke asked the Council to review the proposed plan and contact the Park Board or herself with any questions or input. There was discussion about the time frame for getting it out for bids.

Fred Becker presented information on the FY 09 City and Water Audits.

A motion was made by Alderman Steve Kauling to approve the FY 09 City Audit and Water Audit as presented. The motion was seconded by Alderman Mike Burton and unanimously approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Steve Kauling, David Laws, Mike Burton, Ed Kleber, Don Perez, Brent Sheathelm, Jack Satterfield, and Jeff Taylor; nay – none.

Zoning Board recommendations were presented by Bill Gruen. The first item was the proposed Vincennes Trail Subdivision. Bill said he has concerns about a few issues. The Zoning Board recommended approval of the plat providing they do not have to tie in to city sewer. Frank Richter told the Council that he is trying to keep lots reasonable, so he does not want to become part of the city. They have applied for county zoning. Alderman Kleber asked about the size of the lots. He was told that they are 220 ft. wide and 630 ft. deep. Mayor Fauke said she wants to see Carlyle expand their city limits. She added that it is very difficult to actively enforce zoning issues with a covenant; and not incorporating that subdivision would allow junk cars, livestock and pasture ground. Mayor Fauke said she feels the west end is the future of Carlyle. Frank stated that the parcel is ¹/₂ mile west of the old Wal-Mart on Old State Road. Alderman Fauke said she welcomes development. Mr. Richter said that he is trying to keep the cost of the lots down, and more infrastructure means he would have to cut down the size of the lots to keep them affordable. Mayor Fauke noted that all developers have to invest in their developments. There was discussion about sewer. Duane Nordike voiced concern about wet ditches. Pat Nettemeyer told the Council that there will not be any discharge into the ditches because the EPA no longer allows that.

A motion was made by Alderman David Laws to accept the Zoning Board recommendation to approve the Vincennes Trail Subdivision plat subject to annexation into the city and grant a variance that they will not have to tap into the city sewer system. The motion was seconded by Alderman Don Perez and unanimously approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – David Laws, Mike Burton, Ed Kleber, Don Perez, Brent Sheathelm, Jack Satterfield, Jeff Taylor, and Steve Kauling; nay – none.

The next item was a variance to allow the city scrolling message marquee located at the corner of 5th Street and Route 50. The city is asking to locate it at 6 feet from the east lot line and 7 feet from the south lot line with the sign located approximately 16" above the ground. Alderman Laws said he thinks it is too close to the highway. There was brief discussion.

A motion was made by Alderman Ed Kleber to accept the Zoning Board recommendation to allow placement of the city scrolling message marquee as requested subject to moving it if there is a problem with traffic sight restriction. The motion was seconded by Alderman Jack Satterfield and approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Mike Burton, Ed Kleber, Don Perez, Brent Sheathelm, Jack Satterfield, Jeff Taylor, and Steve Kauling; nay – David Laws.

The next Zoning Board issue was to consider the same density requirement for R5 as is required for R4 multi-family property.

A motion was made by Alderman Ed Kleber to adopt the code text amendment that would apply the same lot sizes to multi-family projects in the R5 as is currently provided in the R4 as recommended by the Zoning Board. The motion was seconded by Alderman Jeff Taylor and unanimously approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Ed Kleber,

Don Perez, Brent Sheathelm, Jack Satterfield, Jeff Taylor, Steve Kauling, David Laws, and Mike Burton; nay – none.

Kevin Wessel asked for approval to continue with the pool project. He was told that the Council had already approved that project.

Frank Richter thanked the Council for their consideration of his development. He added that the city needs another park and he would like to see it on the west end to compliment the development there.

With no further business, a motion to adjourn was made by Alderman Mike Burton and seconded by Alderman Jack Satterfield. The motion was unanimously approved by voice vote, and the meeting adjourned at 8:35 p.m.

A motion was made by Alderman Mike Burton to approve claims as presented. The motion was seconded by Alderman David Laws and approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Mike Burton, Don Perez, Jack Satterfield, Jeff Taylor, Steve Kauling, and David Laws; nay – Ed Kleber. Alderman Brent Sheathelm abstained.

The motion was seconded by Alderman Don Perez and unanimously approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Mike Burton, Ed Kleber, Don Perez, Brent Sheathelm, Jack Satterfield, Jeff Taylor, Steve Kauling, and David Laws; nay – none.

Alderman Kauling reported that the Park Board will meet at 1 p.m. tomorrow, August 25.

Jeff Taylor reminded everyone that the citywide garage sale is September 19.

Alderman Perez reported that the Street & Alley Committee received only one bid of \$48,800 from Holthaus in Beckemeyer on the grader, and they rejected it.

Steve Lappe reported that the west water tower will be out of service on August 25.

Dave Redeker reminded everyone that the arts and crafts festival is Saturday and Sunday, August 29 & 30. Also, Finding Nemo, the movie in the park, will show on Saturday evening.

The second reading of the ordinance amendments for bicycles on sidewalks and the General Dean Bridge were presented by Mayor Fauke. Alderman Kleber said he has heard several comments about giving kids tickets. Chief Newkirk said they would get a warning first. It was noted that a ticket would most likely be in the amount of \$15. There was discussion.

A motion was made by Alderman Jeff Taylor to adopt the amendments regarding bike riding on sidewalks and prohibiting the riding of bikes on the General Dean Bridge. The motion was seconded by Alderman Don Perez and approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Don Perez, Brent Sheathelm, Jack Satterfield, Jeff Taylor, and Mike Burton; nay – Ed Kleber, Steve Kauling, and David Laws.

Mayor Fauke presented information on two different leaf vacuums. One is from Key Equipment and the other is a Tarco unit from Woody's. She told the Council that Danny spent a lot of time researching the best option. Salem and Greenville both have a Tarco, and Greenville just purchased a new Tarco. The machine from Key Equipment is a little cheaper, but Danny thinks the Tarco is better. Mayor Fauke went on to say that it would take one person to drive the dump truck and 2 people to operate the leaf vac. They are looking at hiring a temporary person for 4 months. The city would not have to pay IMRF or benefits. Alderman Kauling asked how many days this person would work. Mayor Fauke told him that they are looking at starting October 15 and working 5 days a week up to Christmas. She added that this would be a big help to keep ditches and storm sewers free from leaves. They are also looking at dumping at the lagoon the first year. There was discussion.

Alderman Laws asked about an ordinance change. Ken Mehochko said it could be changed any time. Don Berdeaux told the Council that there is a place in Hoffman that could take the compost. Geoff Jones asked if there would be a conflict with the union if they hire a temporary person. Mayor Fauke said she didn't see a problem, since they have other part-time people. There was additional discussion. Mayor Fauke reminded everyone that the first year will be a learning experience for everyone. Alderman Laws said the problem with the leaves is that the culverts are smashed, and the Street & Alley Department doesn't have time to replace them. He feels this is a lot of burden on a department that is already short-handed. Alderman Kleber said they took a poll a few years ago, and residents want to keep burning. Mayor Fauke said they will still have that option. Alderman Laws asked if we will charge for the service. He was told that the service will be free of charge. There was lengthy discussion. Alderman Kleber is concerned about the total cost.

A motion was made by Alderman Jeff Taylor to approve the purchase of a leaf vacuum for \$30,847. The motion was seconded by Alderman Steve Kauling and approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Don Perez, Brent Sheathelm, Jack Satterfield, Jeff Taylor, Steve Kauling, and Mike Burton; nay – David Laws and Ed Kleber.

Mayor Fauke told the Council that she met with Mike Kreke and Corey regarding addressing. Carlyle is the only community that does their own addressing, and the county thinks it would benefit us to have them take it over. Alderman Kleber said he is not in favor of handing it over to the county. Alderman Laws asked what the benefit would be. He was told that the main reason is for 911. Kent Newkirk noted that when assigning addresses, you sometimes have to try several addresses before it fits their system. There was discussion.

A motion was made by Alderman Jack Satterfield to allow the county to assign new addresses. Alderman Burton asked if the leaf vac will pick up gum balls. Mayor Fauke said she wasn't sure. Alderman Perez said he thinks it will.

The meeting opened with the pledge of allegiance led by the girl scouts.

Minutes from October 26, 2009, were accepted on a motion by Alderman Don Perez. The motion was seconded by Alderman Steve Kauling and unanimously approved by voice vote.

A motion was made by Alderman Mike Burton to approve the Treasurer's Report as presented. The motion was seconded by Alderman David Laws and unanimously approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Mike Burton, Ed Kleber, Don Perez, Brent Sheathelm, Jeff Taylor, Steve Kauling, and David Laws; nay – none.

A motion was made by Alderman Mike Burton to approve claims as presented. The motion was seconded by Alderman David Laws and unanimously approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Ed Kleber, Don Perez, Brent Sheathelm, Jeff Taylor, Steve Kauling, David Laws, and Mike Burton; nay – none.

Treasurer Chad Holthaus told the Council that the Parks & Recreation Department had a checking account that was not used very much, so it was closed and the money was put into Fund 17.

Alderman David Laws reported on the Water/Waste Water Committee Meeting held October 27, 2009. Everything from that meeting is on tonight's agenda. They also met with HMG regarding vibration of the pumps.

Alderman Steve Kauling reported that demolition of the pool house is complete. Plans for the new one are currently in the hands of the Department of Public Health. Construction will not start until they get approval from the state.

Alderman Perez reported that the highest bid received for the 2003 squad car was \$700 from Kent Berry. The only other bid received was for \$500.

A motion was made by Alderman Don Perez to accept the bid of \$700 for the 2003 squad car. The motion was seconded by Alderman Steve Kauling and unanimously approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Don Perez, Brent Sheathelm, Jeff Taylor, Steve Kauling, David Laws, Mike Burton, and Ed Kleber; nay – none.

Alderman Perez thanked the Police Department for their help with the motorcycle ride on Sunday. He also reported that the Street & Alley Committee is reviewing subdivision codes.

Alderman Burton reported that the EDC met and discussed tourism. He also reported that the Finance Committee met and discussed the property tax levy. These are both agenda items.

Jim Roeckeman reported that Story Hour will be held on Saturday, from 10-11 a.m. On November 24, they will sponsor a program on Lincoln at the Carlyle Jr. High Library.

Bill Gruen reported that the Zoning Board will meet on November 19, 2009. They will be reviewing changes regarding street construction including materials used and street widths. They will also look at height restrictions on fences.

Mayor Fauke presented the second reading of the 2010 Minimum/Maximum Agreement for Risk Management Coverage.

A motion was made by Alderman Don Perez to approve the Minimum/Maximum Agreement for Risk Management Coverage as presented. The motion was seconded by Alderman Jeff Taylor and unanimously approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Brent Sheathelm, Jeff Taylor, Steve Kauling, David Laws, Mike Burton, Ed Kleber, and Don Perez; nay – none.

Mayor Fauke introduced Scott Winter to discuss the FY 2010 Tourism Budget. He told the Council that he met with Bill Gruen and the mayor regarding how they will spend the remaining \$29,100 of their \$30,000 budget. There was discussion. Alderman Taylor said he thinks that's a lot of money. Alderman Burton noted that it comes out of the Hotel/Motel Tax Fund at no cost to the citizens of Carlyle. Scott told the Council that the city gets a 15% enhancement for anything that runs through their office. Alderman Kleber asked if they could promote housing. Bill said it is something they can look at. Mayor Fauke added that mailers are being sent out in regards to targeting people between 55 and 70 years of age. There was brief discussion. Alderman Kleber said he is interested in promoting the city as a retirement community.

A motion was made by Alderman David Laws to approve the FY 2010 Tourism Budget as presented. The motion was seconded by Alderman Brent Sheathelm and unanimously approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Jeff Taylor, Steve Kauling, David Laws, Mike Burton, Ed Kleber, Don Perez, and Brent Sheathelm; nay – none.

Mayor Fauke presented information on the 69 Line replacement bids. A small-scale composite pole was available for the Council to see. The wood poles would cost \$234,000, composite poles \$356,000, and concrete poles \$353,000. Mayor Fauke told the Council that the composite poles have not been on the market long enough to know how they will hold up down the road. The committee recommended using the concrete poles at a cost of \$353,000. It was noted that they will not have to take \$250,000 out of the Electric Reserve.

Alderman Kleber said he doesn't understand why they are replacing the entire line. He added that the current wood poles have been there for 40 years. He is concerned about higher utility bills. Alderman Kleber then asked why the city workers can't set the poles.

Alderman Burton explained the financing issue. He noted that since Larry Hawn retired, about \$70,000 goes back into the Electric Fund. Based on that, he does not anticipate an increase for 8-10 years. It was also noted that regulations for treatment of wooden poles has changed. Alderman Kleber asked about the need for an engine in the very near future. John Hodapp said that has been discussed. He noted that IMEA bought into Prairie State at Lively Grove, and that should help keep rates down.

Alderman Laws said he was told it was a 40-year line, and it's now 43 years old. Alderman Kleber said he's still concerned about replacing poles that are not rotten. Mayor Fauke told the Council that she doesn't feel that replacement of the line has anything to do with a rate increase. She added that she wants to keep up with improvement of infrastructure in all departments, and she feels it is money well spent.

A motion was made by Alderman Steve Kauling to approve \$353,000 for concrete poles for the 69 Line Replacement. The motion was seconded by Alderman Brent Sheathelm and approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Steve Kauling, David Laws, Mike Burton, Don Perez, Brent Sheathelm, and Jeff Taylor; nay – Ed Kleber.

Alderman Burton presented information on the 2010 Property Tax Levy. He told the Council that revenue from interest is down, and we need to increase the tax levy to make up for the fund decrease. A 5% increase was recommended. Alderman Burton noted that we will still be below other taxing bodies. Alderman Kleber said he is not in favor of the increase. Mayor Fauke added that the committee discussed this in length at several meetings. Although it will not be popular, they feel it is the responsible thing to do. This constitutes the first reading.

Mayor Fauke presented information on the ILWARN Water & Wastewater Mutual Aid and Assistance Agreement. With this program we will assist other participants during disasters. Alderman Laws added that it works like the IMEA program. We will send a crewmember and a truck, and the city can get reimbursed. There is no cost unless we use the services. This constitutes the first reading.

Mayor Fauke asked Ken Mehochko if he has reviewed the lawsuit regarding the use of atrazine. He said he would like to contact the attorneys before it is approved. Alderman Kleber questioned whether or not they want to even be part of this suit. There was brief discussion. No action was taken at this time.

Mayor Fauke told the Council that the Annual Joint Review Board Meeting is scheduled for Thursday, December 17, 2009.

Bill Gruen presented the proposed TIF distributions. Developers in TIF 1 would receive \$28, 299.55, TIF 2 developers would receive \$8,788.66 and TIF 3 developers would receive \$8,020.67. Taxing districts would receive \$270,412.44 with about \$163,000 going to the school district. Alderman Kleber asked about Quip. Bill told him that Quip will not be getting any of this TIF money.

A motion was made by Alderman Don Perez to approve the TIF Distributions as presented. The motion was seconded by Alderman Jeff Taylor and unanimously approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – David Laws, Mike Burton, Ed Kleber, Don Perez, Brent Sheathelm, Jeff Taylor, and Steve Kauling; nay – none.

Mayor Fauke presented the TASC Health Reimbursement Account Plan Extension. Bill Gruen added that the city can save about \$30,000 assuming an 11% increase. Alderman Laws noted that the last increase was 22%.

A motion was made by Alderman Jeff Taylor to approve the TASC Health Reimbursement Account Plan Extension as presented. The motion was seconded by Alderman Don Perez and unanimously approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Mike Burton, Ed Kleber, Don Perez, Brent Sheathelm, Jeff Taylor, Steve Kauling, and David Laws; nay – none.

Mayor Fauke thanked all of the departments for helping with leaf clean-up. She said she feels the departments came together as a city, and she commended them for their hard work.

With no further business, a motion to adjourn was made by Alderman Don Perez and seconded by Alderman David Laws. The motion was unanimously approved by voice vote, and the meeting adjourned at 8 p.m.

The motion was seconded by Alderman David Laws and unanimously approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Ed Kleber, Brent Sheathelm, Jack Satterfield, Jeff Taylor, Steve Kauling, David Laws, and Mike Burton; nay – none.

Alderman Kauling told the Council that they are still waiting for the pool house plans to be approved by the Department of Public Health.

Jim Roeckeman reported that the Lincoln program will begin at 2 p.m. at Carlyle Junior High tomorrow.

Dave Redeker reported that the Christmas lights will be turned on Friday at 6:30 p.m.

Mayor Fauke asked the Council what they wanted to do about the last meeting in December since it is after Christmas. It was decided that the Council will meet December 28, 2009, as scheduled.

Bill Gruen presented information on the variance request from Betty Trew for a wheelchair ramp at 251 7th Street. The ramp would be approximately 2 feet from the sidewalk on the east lot line. The Zoning Board recommended approval.

Mayor Fauke presented information on the Taylor, Hitpas, Kauling annexation. She stated that some utility issues need to be discussed by the finance committee. Ken Mehochko said he would like to look at it as well. Mary Ann Kauling asked what the city is going to offer her. She was told that she will have city water and they are looking at sewer extension. There was discussion about property tax increases. Jim Taylor asked about getting street lights. Mayor Fauke told him that she wants to see that done. There was additional discussion about taxes, trash pick-up and recycling. Alderman Kleber asked why these three properties are being singled out to come into the city. Mayor Fauke told him that another property will be discussed later. No action was taken at this time.

There was discussion about the Atrazine lawsuit. Ken Mehochko told the Council that he reviewed the legal services agreement. He is not fond of some of the provisions, but they can't be changed because all contracts for the class-action suit must be the same. There was discussion about the contingent fee. Alderman Kleber said he thinks 40% seems high. Alderman Burton asked for a recommendation. Ken said he would not make a final decision tonight. Alderman Kauling asked if there is a time frame for responding. Attorney Mehochko said it's pretty open-ended. No action was taken at this time.

Bill Gruen asked the Council for approval to use Serpentine Web Solutions for graphic design projects. He said Cheryl Roberts, the owner, is located in Carlyle and would only charge \$36 per hour, which is cheaper than what we currently pay.

A motion was made by Alderman Ed Kleber to approve using Serpentine Web Solutions for graphic design projects. Attorney Mehochko said it does not. Alderman Kleber then asked about changes to the subdivision code. He was told that this would extend it. They were also concerned about the concrete footings encroaching their property and about liability. Dr. Bretz said an 8-ft. fence would be too costly. After discussing the issue, the Zoning Board recommended approval if it is at least 6" off the west property line and Ken Mehochko could be consulted about liabilities and responsibilities regarding maintenance, damage, and injury to property and people.

The motion was seconded by Alderman Steve Kauling and unanimously approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Don Perez, Brent Sheathelm, Jack Satterfield, Jeff Taylor, Steve Kauling, David Laws, Mike Burton, and Ed Kleber; nay – none.

A motion was made by Alderman David Laws to enter into Executive Session to discuss litigation. The meeting opened with the pledge of allegiance led by Alderman Ed Kleber.

A motion was made by Alderman Don Perez to approve minutes from the regular meeting held December 14, 2009. The motion was seconded by Alderman Steve Kauling and unanimously approved by voice vote.

A motion was made by Alderman Mike Burton to approve transfers of \$40,000 to Street & Alley, \$45,000 to Police, and \$5,000 to Playground for a total of \$90,000. The motion was seconded by Alderman Brent Sheathelm and unanimously approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Mike Burton, Ed Kleber, Don Perez, Brent Sheathelm, Jack Satterfield, Jeff Taylor, Steve Kauling, and David Laws; nay – none.

Alderman David Laws reported that the Water and Sewer Committee will meet on January 4, 2010, at 5 p.m.

Alderman Burton told the Council that the Finance Committee met with Mrs. Kauling and discussed the annexation on Old State Road.

The Economic Development Committee will meet on January 4, 2010, at 4 p.m.

Jim Roeckeman reported that the library will be closed New Years Day.

Jim Rudolph addressed the Council about recruiting assistants for the 2010 census. Anyone interested will receive \$11 per hour plus 55 cents per mile. Workers will go door-to-door starting the end of January until the first of March. They will work a minimum of 20 hrs. per week with a maximum of 40 hrs. per week.

Bill Gruen presented information on the TIF II distribution in the amount of \$172,004.75.

A motion was made by Alderman Don Perez to approve the TIF distribution of \$172,004.75 as presented. The motion was seconded by Alderman Jack Satterfield and unanimously approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Ed Kleber, Don Perez, Brent Sheathelm, Jack Satterfield, Jeff Taylor, Steve Kauling, David Laws, and Mike Burton; nay – none.

The Council was asked to approve seeking bids for the new pool house, baby pool and decking. Bids will be opened on January 22, 2010, and a recommendation will go to the Council for approval on January 25, 2010.

A motion was made by Alderman Steve Kauling to approve seeking bids for the pool house, baby pool and decking as requested. The motion was seconded by Alderman Brent Sheathelm and unanimously approved by the following roll call vote: Aye – Don Perez, Brent Sheathelm, Jack Satterfield, Jeff Taylor, Steve Kauling, David Laws, Mike Burton, and Ed Kleber; nay – none.

Mayor Fauke told the Council that there were 50 submissions from 45 artists for the logo contest. They will be reviewed by the Economic Development Committee.

With no further business, a motion to adjourn was made by Alderman Don Perez and seconded by Alderman Jack Satterfield. The motion was unanimously approved by voice vote, and the meeting adjourned at 7:10 p.m.
