## DEPARTMENT: Water/Sewer Department

JOB TITLE: Summer Maintenance

## **General Duties:**

Performs under the supervision of the Water Production and Water Distribution Foreman. This position is a part-time, temporary position that will receive hours only during the summer season, generally late-May through early-August. Work hours are not guaranteed; work will be performed on an as-needed basis, but will generally average 30-40 hours per week during the summer season. Duties include, but are not limited to:

- Report to work at scheduled time.
- Painting various buildings and/or equipment at the Water Plant and throughout the water and wastewater system.
- Power washing buildings and/or equipment.
- Various cleaning duties around the Water Plant and other locations as directed.
- Assist other departments as needed.
- Must follow all safety regulations and employee policies and procedures.
- Other duties as assigned by the Water/Sewer Foreman.

## **Special Requirements:**

- Must be at least 16 years old with a valid Illinois Driver's License with a safe driving record.
- Requires willingness to work in all kinds of weather conditions and to work alone or with a group.
- Able to withstand hard work and physical labor on a continuous basis.
- Must be physically well and can provide a doctor's certification of physical capabilities to perform the prescribed duties outlined in this job description. Re-certification of

individual's physical capabilities may be required by the employer if it is deemed necessary to verify the individual's work capabilities.

- Must be able to pass a background test and a pre-employment drug screen.
- Must be able to lift tools, toolboxes, materials, and parts alone weighing up to 100 pounds.
- Physically able to squat, bend, lay, stand, sit, and work during work hours and events.
